Upriver Food For Thought

To forget how to dig the earth and to tend the soil is to forget ourselves. (Gandhi)

I recently attended a Local Food Forum in Moncton hosted by the Fundy Biosphere Reserve, Post Carbon Greater Moncton, the NB Food Security Action Network, ACORN and the K.C. Irving Chair in Sustainable Development at University of Moncton. What I learned was the average age of the farmer is 56 years old. Our farmers as well as our farm land are disappearing at an alarming rate because we import 85% of the food we eat. The farther our food travels the less control we have over knowing what has gone into it. Some great suggestions to come out of the Local Food Forum were: We can check labels to see where our food is grown and **BUY LOCAL** whenever possible. We can ask questions about where our food comes from and request locally grown food when in season. Choose Atlantic grown and Canadian grown when not available locally. We have many farmers right here in Kent County who produce really good, healthy food. **If at all possible, buy from the farmer. Everyone has the right to affordable, nutritious, locally grown food. When we buy locally, we support local families and that puts money back into our community.**

Other suggestions included: host more Food Forums to raise awareness, start a campaign promoting Farmers; "Who's your farmer?" and develop Community Gardens for those who want to grow their own vegetables but have no garden.

At our last Upriver Community Development meeting, it was suggested we start a Farmers Market that could be held in a different Upriver local every week, this could also be quite attractive to the people who own cottages in our area.
