Here are some great suggestions made by people who completed the Upriver Survey:

- -I had an idea that it might be good to look into the possibility of owning a community van to transport members of the community to events. This would include seniors, students or any group that want to do a group excursion. The system would work on a book-in-advance basis and would require volunteer drivers. The advantage would be for those who don't own such a vehicle and/or don't own a roadworthy car. The van would work on a rental basis.
- -"Some sort of daycare program, sort of a pre-school or after-school educational endeavour-not simply a babysitting service. Also, we seriously need a senior's home in the upriver area-Tout suite!!!"
- -Place to pay phone and hydro bills in area.
- -Learn to dance lessons-any kind, quilting bees/lessons and get togethers.
- -Would like to see a seniors group started.
- -Create a walking/bicycle trail from Kent Junction to Coal Branch between Route 126 and railway track.
- -Living on Route 126 I'd like to have a safe place to walk and bike!
- -I would like to know the rules/regulations on recycling in our community. Ex: cardboard, soup cans, etc. Do we have a recycling program? What about having drop off bins @ the Harcourt Firehall?
- -All suggestions look very interesting.
- -Activities and emotional support for seniors as caregivers.
- -I would be interested in a farmer's market co-op.
- -Hi, I live in Moncton, and very much enjoy our place in Bass river. I have a passion for renewable energy, and would love to see more people adopting its use. We have a solar hot water system on our home and boy does it work.[average July preheat temp.=129f] The initial cost can seem high, but I believe NB Power should follow other

utilities and offer a low cost lease option for those interested. It is not rocket science, if you have a good southern exposure, and use hot water; you need a solar hot water system. This, along with small wind turbines, solar hot air collectors and energy efficiency upgrades will put LOCAL people to work and help save LOCAL people money. Thanks

-I would like to see a waste recycling center. It would be the same as the Westmorland solid waste. The spot I would chose for such a center is the same place we have had a dump before, On Rte 116 near the Pentecostal Church. We charge trucks by weight as they go in, separate and send off for recycling. This would create jobs locally, compost to sell, be better for the environment than bagging our waste in black bags which is sent to the land fill.

-I think all of these ideas are great and important for the environment. The idea that was tossed around before of a Market could be amazing. A wonderful meeting place as well as supporting our local farmers, bakers and crafters.
