Family and Youth Capital Assistance Program (FYCAP) Overview

To provide funding for eligible capital costs of projects in support of youth and family related activities that, without such support, would otherwise not proceed. Assistance will be available to non-profit organizations, local service districts and/or municipalities engaged in youth and family related projects such as playgrounds, sports/recreational facilities, community centres and community equipment. Examples of the sports/recreational facilities include the following: baseball fields, soccer fields, volleyball courts, tennis courts, football fields, skateboard parks, arenas/rinks, youth camps, local and municipal parks. Examples of centres include community, seniors, women's institutes, youth and recreation. Examples of community equipment include recreational and fire brigade.
