LOCAL GOVERNANCE

For those of you who don't know, Weldford and Harcourt are both Local Service Districts and each are eligible to elect a local **advisory committee** to **advise** the provincial government on the budgets for fire services, solid waste management, animal control and street lights.

The Finn Report is a study that Jean-Guy Finn conducted and made suggestions as to how the provincial government might better manage the municipalities and unincorporated regions of NB. New Brunswick has 101 municipalities, four rural communities and 266 local service districts as opposed to Nova Scotia who has 53 municipalities. Local Governance Minister Bruce Fitch has been conducting community meetings to consult with the public on how the conservative government should proceed. The system we have now is very expensive and not working very well; the question is, "what should we do about it".

I attended the consultation meeting in Riverview on May 10th; it was very interesting, to say the least. Volunteer firemen, the mayors of Moncton and Dieppe, counselors and other LSD members, all attended. A real concern is the government forcing amalgamation of LSDs with neighbouring municipalities. Bruce Fitch has stated "there will be no forced amalgamations".

The Finn Report suggests the possibility of a number of neighbouring LSDs merging to create areas with larger populations and sharing services.

Local LSD elections will be held Upriver in the next couple of weeks. LSD elections are open to residents of NB and LSD residents, over the age of 18 but you can't nominate yourself. If you would like to run in the elections, be sure to bring a friend to nominate you.

The election for the Weldford LSD is on Thursday, June 2, 2011 at 7:00pm, at St. Marks Presbyterian Church Hall and the Harcourt LSD election is on Tuesday, June 7, 2011 at 7:00pm at the Harcourt Fire Hall. I urge you to get involved and be part of the solution!
